Visitors to District Facilities

To help protect student and district property and to prevent disruptive activity, district officials must know if any persons who are not members of the staff or student body are inside the building or on the grounds.

Visitors and parents or guardians¹ may be permitted on district premises so long as their presence is for constructive, not disruptive, purposes and district officials approve of their visit.

Visitors to district facilities or on district grounds during the instructional day shall first come to the main school office and arrange to conduct their business.

No individual may trespass in a district facility or grounds. Trespassing means being present in an unauthorized place or refusing to leave when ordered to do so by a duly constituted authority.

Students may not visit in other schools in the district or invite friends from other schools to visit during school hours. Requests to allow nonresident students to visit schools during the normal school day will be denied. Exceptions to serve as a resource person at the request of the classroom teacher may be allowed with the approval of the principal.

Suspended students, not yet reinstated, may not trespass in a district facility, on district grounds or attend a district-sponsored activity.

¹As used in this policy, the term parent includes legal guardian or person in a parental relationship. The status and duties of a legal guardian are defined in ORS 125.005(4) and 125.300 - 125.325. The determination of whether an individual is acting in a parental relationship, for purposes of determining residency, depends on the evaluation of the factors listed in ORS 419B.373. The determination residency, depends on the evaluation of the factors listed in ORS 419B.373. The determination for other purposes depends on evaluation of those factors and a power of attorney executed pursuant to ORS 109.056. For special education students, parent also includes a surrogate parent, an adult student to whom rights have transferred and foster parent as defined in OAR 581-015-0005(18).
