

Tobacco-Free Environment

The following procedures will be used for students who violate the district's tobacco policy:

First Offense

One day detention and conference with student's parent. During detention, the student will be provided with information concerning harmful effects of smoking and will be required to do further research on the effects of smoking.

Second Offense

Two days, out-of-school suspension and performance of service to school or community.

Third Offense

Three days, out-of-school suspension and suspension from extracurricular activities for remainder of semester.

Consistent refusal or neglect to obey the rules may lead to expulsion. Due process procedures shall be followed.

Alternative to Discipline

In conjunction with discipline, students may be referred to a cessation and/or tobacco education class. Attendance at such classes is voluntary. Any cost related to cessation classes is the responsibility of the student and his/her parent. The district may also require the successful completion of a behavior modification plan.

Other

A referral to law enforcement and/or public health or tobacco coalition may be made at anytime.
