Student Athletic/Activity Drug Prevention/Intervention Policy**

Definitions

- “Drugs” Any substance considered illegal for use, purchase and/or consumption by minors (under the age of 21 years old), considered illegal by State or Federal law and/or which is controlled by the use U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Any substance used for “a high” and not used as the recommended or intent use of the substance.
- “Student Participant” Any student in grades 7 through 12, participating in a Baker School District sponsored athletic/activity program. Home-schooled students and alternative school students are included in athletic/activities policies.

Prevention and Intervention Philosophy

Baker School District is committed to providing an environment for students that emphasizes good decision making and healthy choices. The Board of Baker School District 5J is committed to continually strengthening the district’s role in education for the prevention of substance abuse among our students. It is the intent of our drug policy to provide a safe, drug-free environment for students. Although prevention is emphasized, access to intervention programs is an integral component of our policy. Our policy is not meant to be punitive but accountability for choices made by student participants will be a major focus.

Each student participant is given a copy of the Baker Middle School or Baker High School Athletic and/or Activities Policy. Parent and student must sign to abide by the rules and regulations as outlined in these policies prior to participating in an athletic/activities program at either Baker Middle School or Baker High School.
