

Cocurricular/Extracurricular Participation Requirements

All secondary students involved in cocurricular/extracurricular activities must pass each class each nine-week grading period to be able to participate in any cocurricular/extracurricular activity. In addition, a student shall not be failing any subject. Each secondary level shall determine a grade point average necessary to be eligible to participate.

Any student who agrees to participate in a named cocurricular/extracurricular activity, and does not maintain the standard, will meet with the assistant principal or the athletic director and/or a counselor for the purpose of developing a plan for academic success, which may include academic probation. Students who are subsequently found to be ineligible may appeal in writing to the academic eligibility committee with a membership of two teachers, a counselor and one administrator. The purpose of the academic eligibility committee is to consider the written appeal of the participation requirement regulation. The academic eligibility committee shall consider all extenuating circumstances for the failure to meet standards, before issuing a final ruling of eligibility status within five working days.

Each secondary level building will develop a "Code of Conduct" procedure that lists the categories of activities, the process for discipline for violations of the "Code of Conduct," which students are impacted by the code, prohibitions on the use of tobacco, alcohol and unlawful drugs, the necessity for good attendance, and the consequences for failure to maintain the building level "Code of Conduct." Each secondary building shall give written notice of the "Code of Conduct" by placing this code in the student handbook, and by providing additional notices to the parents.
