Student Conduct on Activity Trips

All activity vehicles will carry a designated chaperone(s). This chaperone(s) will assure that students remain seated and follow safety rules during the time the bus is moving.

Students shall be required to limit noise to that acceptable for the safe operation of the vehicle. Profanity, abusive language, misconduct and acts of vandalism will not be condoned. All such acts will be reported to school authorities as soon as practical but no later than the first day of school following the trip. The chaperone has the authority and duty to discipline offenders while on a school trip. Students may be denied return passage on a district vehicle if the parents have been contacted and they agree to assume the responsibility for the student. Students will submit to assigned seating as directed by the chaperone or vehicle driver when requested or be subject to disciplinary action including being banned from future trips. Smoking, chewing tobacco or use or possession of drugs or alcohol is not permitted on district vehicles. No violations of safety or common rules of conduct are to be ignored by the chaperone.
