Trespass Warning

OREGON REVISED STATUTE 164.245 (Class C misdemeanor): A person commits the crime of criminal trespass if he or she enters or remains unlawfully in or upon premises.

Exclusion

The person issuing this warning is authorized by the Centennial School District School Board and the Superintendent of the Centennial School District. Pursuant to ORS 164.205(3)(b) and 164.245, you are hereby informed that your presence is no longer welcome on the below listed Centennial School District property. Should you remain or reenter that property after you have been excluded, you will be subject to prosecution for criminal trespass. **This trespass will continue indefinitely.**

Appeal Process

If you feel that this trespass warning is not justified or you wish to have it rescinded, you must contact the principal of the school where the original exclusion occurred, in writing, within 10 days of the issuance of this trespass warning and request an appeal. This shall remain in force until rescinded.

The above has been explained to me or I have read the above and I understand that I am being duly warned that should I remain or reenter the school district properties marked on the back of this sheet, I will be subject to arrest and prosecution. I also understand the appeal process.

Criteria for trespass warning from district property includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Makes unreasonable noise;

2. Engages in fighting or in violent, threatening behavior or makes offensive physical contact or verbally harasses another or sexually harasses another;
3. Substantially interferes with any right, comfort or convenience of any student, staff member or guest of the district;
4. Engages in any activity, which constitutes a criminal offense, violates a statute, ordinance or any code of conduct for students;
5. Engages in any activity involving firearms, illegal drugs, violence, illegal possession of tobacco or alcohol, or publicly insults another person by abusive words or gestures in a manner intended and likely to provoke a violent response;
6. Damages, defaces or destroys any property belonging to the district, the district's staff, student body or guests;
7. Litters on any district property;
8. Drives in a careless or reckless manner;
9. Possesses or consumes any alcoholic beverage on district property or in district vehicles;
10. Causes a disturbance or incident, which hinders the safe operation of a school bus;
11. Uses tobacco products in violation of the school policy;
12. Any ex-student who was expelled, withdrew while under suspension, or withdrew while expulsion or suspension was being considered;
13. Any student or nonstudent found in violation of the closed campus during school hours who refuses to leave the district property when asked by authorized personnel;
14. Any student on suspension or expulsion status from a district school;
15. While during an interleague or intraleague school contest, competition or performance, the visiting school makes a request to have a person or persons removed from the district property for any of the above listed criteria, which occurred on that district's property.
