Electronic Communications System

CESD's electronic communication and internet access are intended to assist the daily operations of CESD, as well as promote educational excellence in schools by facilitating resource sharing, fostering innovative instructional practices, and improving communication. It is available to students and staff of CESD.

The Internet is an electronic highway connecting thousands of computers and millions of individual users throughout the world and is coordinated through a complex association of government agencies and networks. By providing worldwide electronic resource accessibility, it becomes a valuable research and learning tool when used in a responsible manner.

The superintendent will establish administrative regulations for the use of CESD's system, including compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act.

The administrative regulations will be consistent with sound guidelines as may be provided by CESD, the Oregon Department of Education, and/or the Government Standards and Practices Commission and will include a complaint procedure for reporting violations.

The use of electronic communication and Internet access is a privilege, not a right. Inappropriate use may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal. Authority to access information or data stored in CESD-owned electronic equipment shall only be authorized by the superintendent or designee. Violations of the law will be reported to law enforcement officials and may result in criminal or civil sanctions. Fees, fines, or other charges may also be imposed.

CESD's electronic hardware and software (computers, voice mail, e-mail, etc.) are business resources, owned by CESD and should be used appropriately by employees. CESD reserves the right to access and disclose, as appropriate, all information and data entered and stored in CESD's computers and related electronic equipment. Employees do not have a right of privacy regarding any information or data contained in the district's equipment.

The superintendent will also establish administrative regulations for use of CESD's electronic communications system.

It is the policy of the Board that all members of the Board shall receive access to the Clackamas Education Service District Network at no charge.
