

Public Complaint Procedure

Initiating a Complaint: Step One

Any member of the public who wishes to express a complaint should discuss the matter with the public charter school employee involved.

The Administrator: Step Two:

If such a discussion with the school employee does not resolve the complaint the complainant may file a signed, written complaint within five working days of the meeting with the employee, with the administrator clearly stating the nature of the complaint and a suggested remedy. (A form is available, but is not required.)

The administrator shall investigate the complaint, confer with the complainant and the parties involved and prepare a written report of his or her findings and conclusion within five working days of receipt of the written complaint.

The Board: Step Three Four

If the complainant is dissatisfied with the administrator's findings and conclusion, the complainant may appeal the decision to the public charter school board within five working days of receiving the administrator's decision. The Board may hold a hearing to review the findings and conclusion of the administrator, to hear the complainant and to take such other evidence as it deems appropriate. Generally all parties involved will be asked to attend such meeting for the purposes of presenting additional facts, making further explanations and clarifying the issues.

The Board may elect to hold the hearing in executive session if the subject matter qualifies under Oregon Revised Statutes.

The complainant shall be informed of the Board's decision within 20 working days from the hearing of the appeal to the Board.

The complaint procedure set out above will not be longer than 90 days from the filing date of the original complaint with the school employee.

Complaints against the administrator may be filed with the Board chair. The Board may refer the investigation to a third party.

Complaints against the Board as a whole or against an individual Board member should be made to the Board chair and may be referred to counsel. Complaints against the Board chair may be made directly to any board member.

If a complaint alleges a violation of state standards or a violation of other statutory or administrative rule that the State Superintendent of Public Instruction has appeal responsibilities, and is not resolved at the Board level, then the public charter school will supply the complainant with appropriate information in order to file a direct appeal to the State Superintendent as outlined in Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 581-022-1940.
