Drug and Alcohol Prevention - Health Education

Alcohol and Drug Abuse Program

While drug, alcohol and tobacco use is dangerous in all segments of American society, it poses special risk to young people by denying them the opportunity to develop physically and psychologically. To this end, the district is committed to drug-free schools and intends to send a clear message that alcohol, drug and tobacco use and/or possession is illegal and will not be allowed in the district or at school sponsored events and activities.

The district will develop a written plan for a drug education program that emphasizes prevention, describes intervention referral procedures, outlines the consequences of violating district policy, identifies access and use of federal moneys and includes staff development. After consulting with a committee consisting of a parent, a teacher from each school, a community representative and a health professional, the Board will annually review the plan for revision and readoption.

Prevention Program

The district shall adopt the ADAPE curriculum developed through Eastern Oregon State College for grades K-8. The district shall also provide Board adopted curriculum for grades 9-12. Each student shall receive age appropriate drug/alcohol prevention instruction through health education courses and integration throughout the curriculum. The program will be consistent with the Common Curriculum Goals.

Each year the Board will review the drug/alcohol prevention program results in consultation with the district's drug/alcohol prevention committee. The Board will adopt a program annually.

The district is committed to an aggressive intervention and referral program to eliminate the illegal use of drugs. The program shall include training for staff and a compilation of information on school and community resources and procedures for responding to substance-related incidents to include emergency medical care. The district staff development program shall include an inservice for all staff addressing the district's drug and alcohol prevention program, current drug and alcohol information and their responsibilities within the program.

Parents, students and staff shall receive annually in handbooks information and detailed procedures regarding the district's intervention/referral program. A public information plan will be published in the district newsletter.

Each year students and parents shall receive a code of conduct explaining expected behaviors and related consequences for violations of the conduct code. Students violating the code of conduct prohibiting possessing, using and/or selling drugs and alcohol shall be subject to disciplinary action or referral.

Educators are not policemen and should not be expected to act as such. Therefore, when a student appears to have broken the law, proper authorities will be called to take appropriate action.

Each year the district will actively seek funds to support the activities identified in the district's drug and alcohol prevention program.
