

Student Rights and Responsibilities

The Board affords students the rights that are theirs by virtue of guarantees offered under federal and state constitutions and statutes. In connection with rights are social contract responsibilities that must be assumed by students.

Among these student rights and responsibilities are the following:

1. Civil rights – including the rights to equal educational opportunity and freedom from discrimination; the responsibility not to discriminate against others;
2. The right to receive a free and appropriate public education; the responsibility to attend school regularly and to observe school rules essential for permitting others to learn at school;
3. The right to due process of law with respect to suspension, expulsion and decisions which the student believes injure his/her rights;
4. The right to free inquiry and expression; the responsibility to observe reasonable rules regarding these rights;
5. The right to privacy, which includes privacy in respect to the student’s education records.

Students have the right to know the behavior standards expected of them as well as to know the consequences of misbehavior. The school handbook will reflect all appropriate standards for behavior at Cove Schools. Student handbooks will be made available to students and their parents through annual distribution.
