Assembly of Students

In an effort to provide for the orderly use of facilities by students, the following conditions shall prevail:

1. Activities need to be scheduled with school officials far enough in advance of the activity to prevent conflict with other previously scheduled events or activities. Pre-scheduled school activities have priority over non-school events for use of facilities.
2. Normal classroom activities should not be disrupted on an unplanned basis.
3. The activity should not create a hazard to person or property.
4. The activity needs to be sponsored by a school official or officially recognized school club or organization.
5. Any person who willfully and/or knowingly advocates breaking the law or encourages the commission of immoral acts shall not be permitted to participate.
6. Activities or assemblies which present political, religious or other issues considered controversial need to provide for a balance of viewpoints. The nature of the activity or assembly shall be announced in advance and students shall not be required to attend them.

Students are not to loiter in or about school buildings before classes commence in the morning, after classes are dismissed in the afternoon or during days when the schools are not in session. Exceptions to this policy include scheduled and supervised athletic or activity practices, scheduled club or organization meetings, scheduled and supervised special study activities and library usage. This policy is not meant to deny the use of playground facilities for their intended activities.
