Temporary District Facilities

Rented facilities, movable units and other emergency school housing may be inadequate for long-term public school purposes. Therefore, the Board's aim is to have sufficient permanent facilities to meet the needs of school enrollment and the school program.

If circumstances require immediate space not available in public school buildings, facilities will be leased or movable structures will be used as a temporary measure.

The Board encourages the involvement of staff, parents and the community in the decision making process whenever possible. The superintendent will give due consideration to all such input in his/her recommendation to the Board.

All final decisions regarding the use of temporary district facilities will be made by the Board. Any such facility must conform to all appropriate federal, state and local building and land use codes, health and fire laws, environmental standards and provisions for accessibility and usability as required by the American with Disabilities Act.
