

### **Admission of Non-Resident Students**

The Board has the responsibility to educate the students of the district. It may, at its discretion, admit students from other districts, keeping in mind the primary responsibilities to its own students and to the taxpayers of the district.

The Board reserves the right to admit or deny the admittance of any out-of-district student. Factors that may be considered when making this determination are:

1. Recommendations from the superintendent or counselor of the resident school district and the district;
2. Potential success of the students in Dayville schools, assessing education student's academic, social and emotional needs as reflected in the student's education records and interviews with the student, parent/guardian, past school official, teachers and others as needed;
3. Size of class(es) in which student will be placed;
4. The parent/guardian assumes responsibility to provide transportation to a prearranged pick-up point within the district as determined by the superintendent in consultation with the district bus driver(s);
5. The Board may, at its discretion, set a trial period to determine if the student will fit into the Dayville schools, given academic, social and discipline considerations. This period may be extended as needed;
6. Out-of-district students who are admitted to Dayville schools will be expected to follow the policies and rules of the Dayville schools, in addition to any special conditions as set forth in number 5 above;
7. Out-of-district student's admittance to the district should be reviewed at least annually (or sooner if necessary). Admittance into the Dayville schools does not guarantee continued placement. The Board cannot and will not make a permanent placement of any out-of-district student;
8. Clarification of athletic eligibility acceptance of an out-of-district student to Dayville schools does not guarantee athletic eligibility. Eligibility is determined by Dayville's eligibility policy and by the guidelines and/or rulings of the OSAA;
9. Tuition costs for students unilaterally admitted to the district will be set by the Board at its August meeting using the following factors: per student costs offset by county, state and federal revenues for that student;

10. Tuition costs are to be paid in advance by semester (one-half due at beginning of year);
11. In addition to tuition, if any, each student will pay the regular school fees that all Dayville students pay.
