

Interdistrict Tuition Agreement

Under the authority of ORS 339.125, the policies adopted by the Board of each participating school district, Dayville School District 16J, Grant County, Oregon, (herein referred as the "Attending District") agrees as follows:

1. The Attending District shall admit students, upon Resident District's approval, who are residents of the Resident District to its own regular education resident students, except transportation.
2. Students will be admitted at the discretion of the Attending District, on a case by case consideration, under the following conditions:
 - a. Students will only be admitted at the beginning of a semester;
 - b. Classroom space must be available, in the opinion or within the guidelines on class size of the Attending District.
3. In partial consideration for services supplied its resident students by the Attending District, the Resident District stands ready to admit similarly situated resident of the Attending District, on the same terms and conditions as those set out in this agreement.
4. It is understood that the Attending District shall submit reports to the Resident District showing enrollment, withdrawal and attendance of these students, which shall provide the Resident District with the basis for claiming basic school support funds.
5. The Resident District shall pay the Attending District \$2,500.00 per year for each attending regular education student. Attending District shall submit an itemized statement to the Resident District and payment shall be made as follows: one-half the annual tuition shall be paid following the end of the first semester, and the other one-half the annual tuition shall be paid following the end of the school year. Payment for students who attend any portion of a school year shall be prorated accordingly.
6. Special Education students are generally high cost students. As such Resident Districts shall pay the Attending District \$5,000.00 per year for each attending Special Education Student or the cost of providing special services, whichever is greater. Examples of special services may be the cost of a one-on-one classroom assistant, a wheel chair ramp, or other special equipment needed or required to meet the students' educational needs. If students' needs are fully met by Education Service District or Regional Program personnel or equipment, no charge beyond the charged for regular education students will be made. Any students on an IEP are considered part of the Special Education Program. Resident District may recall students placed on IEPs or students who have had a significant change in the IEPs while on the Attending District or other Resident district at any time within the year.
7. This agreement does not include transportation of said students.
