

## **Use of Tobacco, Alcohol or Drugs**

### **Substance Abuse/Use**

Any ESD student who possesses, uses, sells or delivers tobacco products, controlled substances, alcoholic beverages, intoxicants or drug paraphernalia at an ESD facility or ESD-related activity shall be confiscated by staff and delivered to the program supervisor or superintendent. Any student who violates the prohibitions regarding tobacco, alcohol or controlled substances policies will be subject to the following:

1. Criminal or juvenile action if the violation is such that it warrants a referral to the appropriate agency;
2. Ejection from and/or banishment from ESD property or the area where an ESD-related activity is being conducted;
3. Disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from the ESD program.

If expulsion is indicated as a consequence for a violation involving alcohol, drugs or tobacco, then a condition of reentry will require a completed intake screening through an alcohol/drug intervention service agency and treatment as prescribed.

### **Procedures for Student Violations of Substance Abuse**

1. Any drug/alcohol infraction will be immediately addressed by the staff member who observes the violation.
2. The staff member shall refer the matter immediately to the program supervisor or superintendent for resolution.
3. Ordinarily the superintendent will address violations and prescribe appropriate consequences up to and including suspension from an ESD program or activity for a period of not to exceed 10 days, but in every case, the parents of the student shall be involved in the resolution.
4. If the incident is a first offense for the student but is aggravated because it involves sale, delivery, particularly dangerous substances, particularly large quantities or otherwise, then the student shall be referred for expulsion.
5. If the incident involves a repeated possession or use of substances, then the superintendent should refer for expulsion if that is necessary to facilitate treatment.
6. If a student is expelled for a substance offense, the student shall be conditionally readmitted if and only if conditional readmission facilitates effective intervention and treatment.
