

### **Standard for Student Conduct and Discipline**

School District 4J shall provide students a learning climate in which rights and responsibilities are equally protected and emphasized, in accordance with ORS 339.240.

The board has prepared reasonable written rules of student conduct and discipline that shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, the following topics:

- Assembly of students;
- Dress and grooming;
- Use of motor vehicles;
- Search and seizure;
- Attendance;
- Freedom of expression;
- Trespassing;
- Alcohol, drugs, tobacco;
- Physical discipline;
- Education records;
- Discipline, suspension, and expulsion;
- Freedom of religion;
- Nondiscrimination;
- Serious misconduct;
- Cooperation with law enforcement agencies.

The superintendent shall be responsible for wide distribution of the rules of conduct and discipline in order that students may understand the expectations of the district. (See *Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook*.)
