

## Student Organizations

Glide Schools take great pride in their extracurricular clubs and organization. Student organizations may be either curriculum-related or voluntary student-initiated clubs that are not curriculum-related.

“*Curriculum-related*” student organizations must meet one of the following criteria:

1. The group’s subject matter is actually taught (or will soon be taught) in a regularly offered course;
2. The group’s subject matter concerns the body of courses as a whole; or
3. Participation in the group is required for a particular course or results in academic credit.

“*Voluntary student-initiated clubs*” must:

1. Be voluntary and student-initiated;
2. Not be sponsored by the school, the government, or its agents or employees;
3. Not materially and substantially interfere with the orderly conduct of the educational activities within the school; and
4. Not be directed, controlled, conducted, or regularly attended by “*nonschool*” persons.

To ensure quality programs on campus, all curriculum-related student clubs must be a part of the associated student body organization, approved by the student council and administration. Voluntary student-initiated clubs must be approved by the student council and administration. Formation and dissolution of any club or organization in Glide Schools must adhere to the guidelines and procedures found in IGDA/JFJ-AR.
