Electronic Communications System

The Board is committed to the development of a quality, equitable and cost-effective electronic communications system. The system's purpose shall be for the advancement and promotion of learning and teaching.

The ESD's electronic communications system shall be referred to as Juniper-Net. It will be used to provide statewide, national and global communications opportunities for staff and students.

Juniper-Net provides access to the Internet network. Internet does not control or monitor the content of materials on the network. However, the Juniper-Net shall filter those areas mutually agreed by the LEA users. In addition, our staff will monitor student use and seek the most current methods to prevent student access to inappropriate materials. The ESD will not allow students access to the Internet unless parent(s) of the student have given prior written permission.

The superintendent will establish administrative regulations governing use of Juniper-Net for ESD staff and ESD facility use. The administrative regulations will be consistent with sound guidelines as may be provided by the ESD and/or the Oregon Department of Education. Use of Juniper-Net will be monitored by the ESD System Administrator.

Failure to abide by the ESD policy and administrative regulations governing use of Juniper-Net may result in loss of system access.
