Reporting of Hazards

Through routine inspection of all facilities and through training of staff, it is expected that all hazardous or potentially hazardous conditions will be identified and will be reported to the district safety officer as soon as they are identified.

Upon receiving such report, the safety officer will take immediate steps to correct the unsafe conditions and will report both the conditions and corrective measures taken to the superintendent and to the Board.

The superintendent will develop and maintain a written hazard communication program for the district. All personnel who, during the performance of their duties, or in an emergency, may be exposed to hazardous chemicals will be informed and trained to deal appropriately with these chemicals. All employees will be trained to recognize and respond appropriately to the presence of hazardous chemicals.
