

Use of Feature Films/Videos in the School**

Prior to showing a feature film/video in a school, the instructor must seek the written approval of the principal. At least five days prior to the showing, the instructor shall submit to the principal (in writing) the following information on the particular film:

1. Title, brief description, and audience rating (G, PG, PG-13, R);
2. The specific instructional purpose for showing the film and its match with course objectives and state standards;
3. Proposed date of showing;
4. A copy of the permission form/notification that will be sent to parents if the film is rated PG or PG-13 at grades K-5, PG-13 at grades 6-8 or rated R at grades 9-12;
5. If parent permission is required, a description of the alternative activity that will be provided for students not viewing the film.

Instructors are required to preview all film media before showing to students.

A parent of students in grades K-5 must give prior consent before his/her child may view a film rated PG or PG-13. A parent of students in grades 6-8 must give prior consent before his/her child may view a film rated PG-13. A parent of students in grades 9-12 must give prior consent before his/her child may view a film rated R. Films rated R may only be shown at grades 9-12.

Edited or unrated films/videos will be shown at the discretion of the administrator and only after administrative approval has been obtained.
