Secret Societies - Gangs

The Board feels that the presence of secret societies and their activities can cause a substantial disruption of or material interferences with school and school activities. A secret society as defined in this policy is any group of two or more persons whose purposes include the commission of illegal acts and/or violation of the school code of conduct. By this policy, the Board acts to prohibit existence of secret societies as follows:

No student on or about school property or at any school activity:

- 1. Shall wear, possess, use, distribute, display or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, sign or other things which are evidence of membership or affiliation in any secret society;
- 2. Shall commit any act or omission, or use any speech, either verbal or nonverbal (gestures, handshakes, etc.) showing membership or affiliation in a secret society;
- 3. Shall use any speech or commit any act or omission in furtherance of the interests of any secret society, including, but not limited to:
 - a. Soliciting others for membership in any secret society;
 - b. Requesting any person to pay protection or otherwise intimidating or threatening any person;
 - c. Committing any other illegal act of other violation of school district policies;
 - d. Inciting other students to act with physical violence upon any other person.

The Board may order the suspension of any student who belongs to a secret society.

After consulting with parents, teachers, students, local community and state agencies, the district will develop a comprehensive program that addresses gang involvement and related violent activities. The comprehensive program will be coordinated with the district's drug and alcohol health education plan.
