

### **Home Schooling/Part-time School Enrollment**

Home-schooled students who are properly registered through the ESD may have access to certain programs of the district when space is available.

Home-schooled students will be permitted to enroll in classes such as physical education, instrumental and vocal music, or other nonacademic elective classes if space is available. They will not have priority in class selection, nor will they be permitted to enroll in more elective classes than students enrolled in the regular program.

Home-schooled students will be permitted to enroll in courses if space is available.

Home-schooled students may participate in interscholastic activities if they meet OSAA requirements and if they meet the requirements listed in Board policy IBDJA - Relations with Home-Schooled Students. They may also participate in after-school intramural sports.

As stated in Board policy IBDJA - Relations with Home-Schooled Students, parents are responsible for transportation for students attending selected school offerings.

Home-schooled students not attending classes in the buildings, will not participate in school functions or activities such as assemblies, dances, graduation, etc. However, students who are part of an athletic team or performing group, will be permitted to attend assemblies or programs where their group is performing or being recognized. Students must meet building eligibility requirements in order to attend dances or other school functions.

Home-schooled students will not participate in schoolwide programs such as student government, scholastic recognition, or behavioral award programs. These programs include Scotty Club, Presidential Academic Fitness, Block "L," Honor Roll or other scholastic recognition programs, Honor Society, Student of the Month, and others of a similar nature. Home-schooled students will be eligible for recognition given in the specific classes in which they are enrolled, and for awards earned through participation in interscholastic or intramural after-school sports.

Students must meet district credit requirements in order to participate in graduation ceremonies.
