Suspension

Reported violations of the discipline code subjects the student to immediate suspension. If, after a conference with the student, the decision is to suspend, the administrator shall at once notify the parent or guardian of the action, the reason for the action and the length of the suspension as well as the conditions applied for re-admittance of the student.

A second violation shall result in a longer suspension, in no case longer than 10 days.

A third violation of this code will require attendance of the student and his/her representative before the Board to consider why the student should not be expelled.

Violations of other rules shall be handled as indicated below. No student shall be suspended without first having been given the opportunity for a conference with the administrator. Violations may accumulate through re-occurrence of the same violation or a combination of several different violations.

1. Serious violations shall be reported to the administrator by a staff member or supervisor. The administrator shall discuss the behavior with the student.
2. Following a reported second violation by a student, the administrator shall again discuss the behavior with the student and shall also contact the home and report the behavior.
3. A reported third violation, which is substantiated by a conference with the student, shall result in suspension of not less than two days nor more than 10 days with procedures to be followed as set forth in the first paragraph.
4. A fourth substantiated violation shall result in a suspension of 10 days and a recommendation by the administrator to the Board regarding the advisability of expulsion.
5. Students who are suspended from school will not participate in athletics or any other extracurricular activity.

Violations of other items of standard operating procedures in the school, which are well known to all students, shall be handled at the administrator's discretion but may, if necessary, be handled in the same manner.
