Reporting of Hazards

Through routine inspection of all facilities, materials and equipment, as well as through staff training, all hazardous or potentially hazardous conditions will be identified, reported and corrected.

The Safety Committee will develop and maintain a written hazard communication program for the district. All personnel who, during the performance of their duties, or in an emergency, may be exposed to hazardous chemicals will be informed and trained to deal appropriately with these chemicals. All employees will be trained to recognize and respond appropriately to the presence of hazardous chemicals.

The Helix School Board encourages any employee or citizen who knows of a condition which he/she believes to be hazardous in a school building or on school grounds or other district property to bring the condition to the attention of the appropriate school official immediately. The superintendent/principal is the usual official to be notified. The official so notified shall investigate the reported hazard and shall take appropriate action.
