

District Athletic/Activities Eligibility

The following eligibility requirements apply to students who participate in district sanctioned athletics and activities. Participating students are required to demonstrate desirable behavior, satisfactory attendance and academic progress as determined by the following district criteria:

Eligibility Rules

To be eligible to participate in athletics/activities at Imbler High School, a student must comply with the rules of the OSAA and Imbler High School. Students engaged in extra-curricular activities will be expected to maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average and maintain passing grades in at least six classes during the time of the activity.

Grades will be checked at mid-quarter. Any student that has below a 2.0 grade point average or is failing two or more classes will be placed on academic probation for two weeks. This means that the individual is removed from competition for two weeks and practice for one week during the two week period. At the end of the two week period, the student's academic progress will be checked by the principal. If in the determination of the principal the student is making reasonable progress to improve, the student will be admitted to full participation. If the student is not making a reasonable effort to improve at the end of the two week probationary period, the student will be removed from further participation in that activity.

If a student does not pass six solid subjects, he will be ineligible until he passes six solid subjects the next semester.

In addition to the credit requirement, a student must be making satisfactory progress towards the school's graduation requirements as determined by the local school administration.

A student will not be able to participate in an extra-curricular activity, including contest or practice, if they have been absent for more than three classes per day. Consideration will be given **only** for medical/dental appointments, family emergencies or school-related functions only. A student must be regular in attendance.

Any student who has received any article of compensation for athletic/activity skill during the school year, other than the school's official athletic letter or awards given by the OSAA or recognized school activities, shall be declared ineligible.

Before a student can participate in athletics after having transferred from another school, a transfer certificate properly signed by the principal or superintendent of the school he enters must be filed with the OSAA office.

Students are not allowed to participate on any organized team while a member of a similar high school team.

Behavioral Standards

Students participating in athletics/activities program are expected to meet all academic requirements. Students participating in athletic programs are also expected to meet all physical education requirements. It is very important to conduct oneself in an exemplary manner, because these students are under constant and continuous observation by the public.

Special Education Students

Exceptions to participation requirements will be made only when the disabling condition, as identified in a student's IEP, prevents the student from achieving the required grade point average, behavior standard or attendance requirement.

Alternative Program Students/Charter School Students

Flexibility will be provided for these students as it relates to transferring into and out of an alternative program/charter school. The academic, behavior and attendance requirements appropriate to the student's placement shall all apply once a student begins participation.

Home-Schooled Students

Home-schooled students will be considered eligible for participation if they meet the following criteria:

1. The student is in compliance with all the rules governing home schooling and can provide acceptable documentation of compliance to the district;
2. The student can meet the district's eligibility requirements with the exception of attendance;
3. The student need not meet class requirements of the voluntary association administering the activity;
4. The student can achieve the minimum achievement test score required of home-schooled students. Students may participate while awaiting test results;
5. The student must fulfill the same responsibilities, standards of behavior and performance, including related class or practice requirements, as other students participating in the activity. The student must also comply with all public school requirements during the time of participation;
6. The student must reside in the attendance boundaries of the school for which the student participates.
