

## Use of Alcohol and Drugs\*\*

### Procedures

#### 1. First Offense

The administrator shall:

- a. Notify appropriate law enforcement/juvenile agency;
- b. Notify and request an immediate conference with the parents/guardians of the student. This conference will be with the principal;
- c. Suspend the student for a violation of district rules for five school days, with an expulsion recommendation pending;
- d. In a case of a student sharing narcotics, alcohol, unauthorized medication or other drugs, the administrator shall require, as a condition of being readmitted into the district's educational programs, a chemical abuse evaluation to be performed by an approved third party at the parent/guardian expense. The results of the evaluation and/or treatment, if required, must be submitted to the principal for consideration. The student and parents/guardians must agree to fulfill the recommendations of the evaluator and submit necessary progress reports to the principal. If the recommendation is completed to the principal's satisfaction, the expulsion recommendation may be eliminated as an option;
- e. If the student refuses to undergo the evaluation or the parents/guardians support that stance and/or refuse to follow the recommendations, if any, for treatment, a recommendation for expulsion to the full extent of the law shall be implemented;
- f. If it is established that a student is found to be selling alcohol and/or other drugs to another person, that student shall be recommended for expulsion from school to the full extent of the law.

#### 2. Second Offense

All factors in one remain the same except the suspension shall be seven days and chemical abuse evaluation is required for readmission to school;

#### 3. Third Offense

Expulsion recommendation to full extent of the law.

### Extracurricular Activities

Students in extracurricular activities will lose the privilege of participation. Specific guidelines will be determined in team training rules.
