

Student Progress Reports to Parents**

The Board believes that parents need and want to know how their students are performing in school. An effective dialogue between parents and teachers will benefit staff, students, and parents, and will help students be successful.

The school will report a student's progress to the student and his/her parents. The report will be clear, concise, and accurate, and will provide a basis of understanding among teachers, parents, and students for the benefit of the individual student.

Parents will be notified as soon as possible when a child's performance or attitude shows marked or sudden change.

In an effort to promote effective communications with individuals with disabilities, the school will provide progress reports in an alternative format upon request and with appropriate advance notice. Full consideration will be given to the requests of the person with a disability in the selection of appropriate auxiliary aids and services.

The superintendent is directed to develop reporting procedures to keep parents apprised of student successes and problems.
