

Scholarships and Student Awards

The principal or designee will maintain a calendar of events for awarding of scholarships and certificates of accomplishments to students and student/athletes.

1. The principal or designee will review and approve proposed trophies, prizes, scholarships or other awards from school established committees and activities.
2. The professional staff will maintain a set of criteria and procedures for presenting awards to students for scholarships and distinguished services in school activities.

The administration will maintain an active file of academic and nonacademic scholarship available to the students of the district.

This file will be readily available for students to review throughout the year. A binder should be maintained at the circulation counter in the library and kept up to date.

The principal or designee will seek guidelines from nonschool donors who wish to have Jewell School District students submit applications. The principal or designee may seek permission from nonschool donors for award presentation at scheduled school celebrations.

Extracurricular and cocurricular events, including but not limited to athletic participation awards should follow these guidelines:

1. The principal or designee will review and approve proposed trophies, prizes, scholarships or other awards from athletic participation or extracurricular activities;
2. The professional staff will maintain a set of criteria and procedures for presenting awards to students for athletic participation and distinguished services in school.

All honors (school and nonschool), awards and scholarships will be conferred under the supervision of the principal or designee.

The Jewell School District Academic Scholarships are available to students completing the requirements for a district diploma (see Board policy IKF - Graduation Requirements). Students must have attended Jewell High School one year being their senior year with 90 percent attendance, excluding absences for school approved activities.

Students must also have:

1. Attended Jewell High School a minimum of 2.5 years and have a minimum GPA of 2.50;

2. The district may award a scholarship up to \$4000 to each qualifying student (\$2000 per year for 2 years).

Students who exceed 11th grade state assessments may receive an additional \$250 for each assessment exceeded up to a maximum of \$1000. It is the intention of the district to distribute this total amount over two years. Petitions for different distributions may be made to the superintendent.

The scholarship may be applied toward any expenditure related to fees, tuition, books or housing at any accredited institution of post-secondary learning (i.e., university, community college, technical or trade school) and will be paid directly to the school. Students may be enrolled part-time or full-time. Scholarship funds will be available for up to 4 years after initial award or as designated in the guidelines for the Jewell School District Academic Scholarship.

Payments for each year will be made upon receipt of proof of registration.
