

### **Student Freedom of Assembly**

1. Principals in the secondary schools shall establish rules for building use within the language and intent of the policy, including the following:
  - a. Determining the specific times when student groups shall have access to the building;
  - b. Establishing written guidelines and timelines for applying for building use;
  - c. Approving requests for nonschool visitors to attend a school sponsored club or to attend a noncurriculum meeting;
  - d. Establishing reasonable rules of conduct which, when violated, may result in exclusion from further building use; and
  - e. Monitoring the activities of groups and individuals to determine their compliance with policies and regulations.
2. Conflicts between school sponsored clubs and non-curriculum-related groups in requesting building use shall be resolved in favor of school sponsored clubs.
3. The maximum number of attendees at any meeting shall not exceed the capacity of the room or facility because of safety considerations.

#### **Student Organizations**

A club's charter must be consistent with the mission of the district:

The district is committed to providing each student with a strong academic program in a safe and supportive educational environment. Our schools strive to foster a love of learning, to instill a sense of civic and social responsibility, and to develop the intellectual, physical and social skills necessary for life-long personal achievement.

All clubs must be student-initiated.

Student-initiated clubs must obtain a volunteer staff advisor.

All official club meetings will be held on campus with the advisor present.

Students may plan school-sponsored activities to occur. Activities planned without support, knowledge, or participation of a club advisor will not be considered school sponsored.

New clubs must be approved by the school's ASB. In the proposal submitted to ASB, the purpose statement of the club must show how it is connected to the school district's mission.

Clubs must operate in compliance with all federal, state and district policies, regulations, and guidelines.
