

Reporting of Hazards

Through routine inspection of all facilities, materials and equipment as well as through training of staff, all hazardous or potentially hazardous conditions will be identified, reported and corrected.

The superintendent will develop and maintain a written hazard communication program for the district. All personnel who, during the performance of their duties or in a foreseeable emergency, may be exposed to hazardous chemicals will be so informed and will be trained to deal appropriately with these chemicals. Employees will be trained to recognize and respond appropriately to the presence of hazardous chemicals.
