

At-Risk Student Program

The overall objective in addressing the educational deficiencies of at-risk students is to provide a positive environment conducive to the promotion of academic success whereby these students are no longer “at-risk” of failure to achieve or of dropping out of school. Partnerships between parents, local businesses, service agencies, and the schools provide opportunities to mobilize the community and solidify efforts to eliminate the causes of student alienation from the home, school, and the community.

Any student who runs the risk of not acquiring the knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to become a productive adult is at risk. Indicators of at-risk may include: drug and alcohol abuse, disruptive and/or delinquent behavior, teen pregnancy, excessive school absences, dropping out of school, and low academic achievement.
