

Extracurricular Programs

Cocurricular/Extracurricular activities under the sponsorship of the district will be organized, supervised and conducted according to Medford School District policies and procedures.

Cocurricular/Extracurricular activities are considered to be any activity such as, but not limited to, student government, contests, athletics and clubs. Participants in these activities will be subject to the basic rules established for the cocurricular/extracurricular activity, the district's student code of conduct and the Medford School District Extra Curricular Code of Conduct. Activity advisors or coaches who issue any additional rules for individual activities must obtain approval from the building administrator or designee prior to allowing participation.

These rules are to be followed and enforced by activity coaches or advisors. Offenses will be handled by district-approved procedures. Student discipline may include, but not limited to, removal from the activity and/or loss of position or office.

Students who represent the school in voluntary activities may be required to conform to dress and grooming standards approved by the building administrator or designee and may be denied the opportunity to participate if those standards are not met.
