Public Conduct on MESD Property

No person on MESD property or grounds, including parking lots, will:

- 1. Injure, attempt or threaten to injure or create a risk of injury to any person.
- 2. Damage the property of another or of MESD.
- 3. Initiate or circulate a report, one knows to be false, concerning an alleged hazardous substance, impending fire, explosion, catastrophe or other emergency that will take place in or upon a school.
- 4. Violate parking regulations.
- 5. Drive a vehicle in an unsafe manner.
- 6. Impede, delay or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of MESD's educational program or any other activity taking place on MESD premises or at MESD-sponsored activities on or off MESD premises.
- 7. Enter any portion of MESD premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and authorized by MESD officials.
- 8. Possess or use a weapon or use a dangerous weapon at any time, including non-school hours, on MESD premises or at MESD-sponsored activities on or off MESD premises. Weapon means an unauthorized loaded or unloaded firearm as defined in 18 U.S.C. 921, a deadly weapon as defined in ORS 161.015(2) or a replica of such firearm or weapon. Dangerous weapon means any weapon, device, instrument, material substance, animate or inanimate, which under the circumstances in which it is used, attempted to be used or threatened to be used, is readily capable of causing death or serious physical injury. A law enforcement officer or other person lawfully entitled to possess a weapon shall report possession of a weapon to the MESD official in charge of the MESD premises at the time of entering the premises or place of the activity.
- 9. Use, distribute or sell tobacco and marijuana products or inhalant delivery systems.
- 10. Use tobacco in violation of Board policy KGC, deliver or sell tobacco at any time, including non-school hours, on MESD premises, in an MESD vehicle or at MESD-sponsored activities on or off MESD premises.
- 11. Wear, possess, use, distribute, display or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, sign or other things which are evidence of membership or affiliation in any gang. Use speech or commit any act or omission in furtherance of the interests of any gang or gang activity. A "gang" is defined as a

group that identifies itself through the use of a name, unique appearance or language including hand signs, claiming of geographical territory or the espousing of a distinctive belief system that frequently results in criminal activity.

12. Willfully violate other rules and regulations adopted by the Board designed to maintain public order on MESD property.

Persons having no legitimate purpose or business on MESD premises or violating or threatening to violate the above rules may be ejected from the premises and/or referred to law enforcement officials.

The superintendent and cabinet shall develop administrative regulations for implementing this policy.
