Video Surveillance

The Board recognizes the district's continuing responsibility to maintain and improve discipline, and to ensure health, welfare and safety of its students and staff.

The Board, after having carefully weighed and balanced the rights of privacy of students and staff with the district's duty to ensure discipline, health, welfare and safety of students and staff at school, supports the use of video surveillance cameras in school facilities and on school grounds.

The district shall notify its students and staff that video surveillance may occur on any school property. The district shall incorporate said notice in the student handbooks at each school.

The use of video surveillance equipment on school grounds shall be supervised and controlled by the building administrator or other responsible administrator.

Students in violation of district conduct rules shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with established Board policy and administrative regulations governing student conduct and discipline.

The use of surveillance equipment shall be subject to the other policies of the district including policies concerning the confidentiality of student and personnel records.

The superintendent shall develop procedures for the notification of staff, students, parents and others, as necessary, of the use of video cameras on school property and such other procedures as may be required for the implementation of this policy.
