

E-Mail Acceptable Usage

Myrtle Point School District (MPSD) provides electronic mail services as both a primary communication medium and as a service to the K-12 community. This policy is intended as a minimal framework to prevent the misuse of these services and to limit the liability of offering these services.

Appropriate Use:

MPSD is a publicly funded entity. It is expected that the use of its equipment and services is confined to its intended purposes. Inappropriate use or behavior on MPSD systems may result in account termination and/or legal action.

Appropriate use of MPSD e-mail includes the following:

1. Use for educational purposes;
2. Use for public communication as determined by MPSD;
3. Use for research;
4. Use for any other purpose(s) as determined by MPSD.

Inappropriate Use

1. Any and all illegal purposes;
2. Transmitting threatening, obscene, or harassing materials;
3. Transmitting anything that interferes with or disrupts network users, services or equipment;
4. Transmitting unsolicited e-mail to multiple ISP accounts either directly or SMTP relay.

Privacy: All MPSD users including the system administrators are expected to respect the privacy of its users e-mail. Reading of e-mail which was not addressed specifically to you is expressly prohibited. The MPSD administrators do not inspect e-mail for any purpose without prior notification.

SPAM: In an attempt to better serve and protect the privacy of our staff and all Internet users, the district promulgates the following policy on "spamming". "Spamming" is a term used to refer to the broadcast of unsolicited e-mail, with or without commercial purposes. MPSD formally rejects the use of its network for such purposes and will actively work to use all technical and legal remedies available to prevent all incidents of unsolicited junk e-mail.

Footnote: MPSD which owns most of the systems and the transport medium (either collectively or as a part of a contract) have the right to inspect and reproduce your transactions providing that they first give notice of these activities.
