

Admission of Nonresident Students by Tuition

Students not qualifying as residents shall be considered nonresidents and shall not be admitted to the schools of the district without payment of tuition or an interdistrict agreement with the student's resident district. This policy addresses admission of non-resident students for tuition only.

If a nonresident student is admitted, the district will assume no responsibility for transportation of the nonresident student to and from school, but permission may be granted the student to ride school buses on established bus routes.

Continued admission of nonresident students shall be contingent upon the student's maintenance of satisfactory attendance, behavior and effort.

Nonresident tuition students may be accepted in district schools when there are sufficient facilities to accommodate them without hardship to resident students of the district and (when possible) without necessitating additional construction of school facilities. The superintendent's office shall decide whether or not to accept individual tuition students and shall designate the school or schools such students are to attend.

Nonresidents desiring to attend district schools must make application in writing to the superintendent.

The tuition rates shall be uniformly applied to all nonresident students who are not entering through an interdistrict agreement with another Oregon district.

Tuition must be prepaid.

Students paying tuition will not be claimed by the district for purposes of State School Fund moneys.

A nonresident student who anticipates establishing residence must do so within the trimester. The parent/guardian must sign an affidavit agreeing to pay tuition retroactive to the date of student enrollment in the event occupancy is not consummate within the trimester.
