Staff/Student/Parent/Guardian (or Person in Parental Relationship) Relations**

The Board encourages parents to be involved in their children's educational activities, and unless otherwise ordered by the courts, an order of sole custody on the part of one parent shall not deprive the other parent access to their child's school records and activities.

In addition, the noncustodial parent has the following authority:

1. To receive and inspect their student's education records and to consult with school staff concerning their child's welfare and education, to the same extent as provided the custodial parent;
2. To inspect and receive governmental agency and law enforcement records concerning the child to the same extent as provided the custodial parent;
3. To consult with any person who may provide care and treatment for the child and to inspect and receive the child's medical, dental and psychological records to the same extent as provided the custodial parent;
4. To authorize emergency medical, dental, psychological, psychiatric or other health care for the child if the custodial parent is, for practical reasons, unavailable;
5. To apply to be the child's conservator or guardian or person in parental relationship.

It is the responsibility of the custodial parent to provide any court order that curtails the rights of the noncustodial parent at the time of enrollment or any other time a court order is issued.

In the absence of such an order, the enrolling parent will be notified that the school's intent is to allow the participation of the noncustodial parent in the full range of school activities, not to curtail visiting the child at school, picking up the child at school, or excusing the child from school.
