Cocurricular/Extracurricular Activities

The Board shall provide a diversified interscholastic and extracurricular program that serves the interests and needs of district students within district resources.

The diversified program shall offer individual students opportunities to grow physically, intellectually and socially through participation in a variety of activities.

The activity program may include:

1. School or class government;
2. Course or curriculum-related activities,
3. Clubs or organizations;
4. Leadership groups;
5. Activities as an extension of the classroom;
6. Interscholastic athletics;
7. Individual or group intramural sports; or
8. Activities that promote leisure-time interests, wholesome recreational and social activity, and opportunities to develop skills in democratic cooperation.

Qualified advisors, coaches, and supervisory personnel shall be provided for all school-sponsored activities.

Interscholastic and extracurricular activities/athletics are considered school related and shall be conducted under the supervision of school personnel and are subject to school regulations and the student code of conduct.

The district shall adhere to the policies, rules, and regulations for those programs governed by the Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) and the State Board of Education.
