

Personal Communication Devices and Social Media

Students may use and possess personal communication devices on district grounds or a school by school basis subject to the discretion of the principal and the following:

1. Personal communication devices shall not be used in a manner that disrupts the educational process, school programs or activities, or in a manner that violates law, Board policy, administrative regulation or school rules;¹
2. Unless authorized by a district representative for health or safety reasons, or in the event of an emergency situation that involves imminent physical danger, devices shall be turned on and operated only before and after the regular school day, between classes and during a student's lunch break;
3. Cellular telephones which have the capability to take "photographs" or "moving pictures" shall not be used for inappropriate purposes while on district property or at school-sponsored events;¹
4. The district shall not be responsible for loss, theft or damage to personal communication devices brought to district property or school-sponsored events;
5. Personal communication devices must not be displayed in plain view during prohibited times of use;
6. Personal communication devices such as Palm Pilots, personal digital assistants (PDAs) and laptop computers, may be used as electronic study aids during the school day if provided as a part of a student's individualized education plan (IEP), or if permission is received from the student's teacher;
7. The use of personal communication devices in any way to send or receive messages, data or information that would pose a threat to academic integrity, contribute to or constitute academic dishonesty is strictly prohibited;
8. The use of personal communication devices in any manner that would violate the confidentiality or privacy rights of another individual is strictly prohibited;
9. Students shall comply with these and any additional school rules as established by the principal and classroom rules as approved by the principal concerning the appropriate use of personal communication devices;

¹The taking, disseminating, transferring, or sharing of obscene, pornographic, or otherwise illegal images or photographs, whether by electronic data transfer or otherwise (commonly called texting, sexting, emailing, etc.) may constitute a crime under state and/or federal law. Any person taking, disseminating, transferring, or sharing obscene, pornographic, or otherwise illegal images or photographs will be reported to law enforcement and/or other appropriate state or federal agencies.

10. Personal communication devices used in violation of law, Board policy, administrative regulation or approved school rules will be confiscated, turned in to the school office and returned to the student or parent following parent notification, conference, detention, suspension, expulsion and/or referral to law enforcement officials as appropriate;
11. Students may not access social media sites using district equipment, unless the posting is approved by a district representative;
12. Social Media Web sites are Web sites such as, but not limited to Facebook, My Space and Twitter.
