Tobacco, Alcohol and other Illegal Drug Intervention/Referral

The possession, selling or using tobacco, alcohol or other illegal drugs by students will not be tolerated in North Marion schools, on the school grounds or during school sponsored events and activities.

The Board recognizes the district's responsibility to support a discipline policy and intervention procedure which prohibits student tobacco, alcohol or other illegal drug use and to establish a CORE Intervention Team in each building to support prevention, intervention and referral activities and to work with the administration in implementing the policy and procedures related to student tobacco, alcohol and other illegal drug use.

The district policy and intervention procedures shall be enforced by all school employees and apply to all students while under school jurisdiction. District administrative regulations shall be implemented to provide for intervention, discipline, referral, suspension and/or other appropriate actions and shall be referred to the CORE Intervention Team for action. The primary purpose of this policy is to be helpful, not judgmental in dealing with these problems.

In instances of self-referral by another student or a parent, the counselor and/or administrator will confer and suggest possible non-binding alternatives. Students will not be penalized for asking for help to overcome the use of tobacco, alcohol or other illegal drugs.

In general, drug emergencies will be handled like a serious accident or illness. Therefore, the procedures to be taken shall be included in the district's comprehensive first aid/emergency plan.
