Board Meeting Agenda

The Superintendent and Board Chairman will prepare an agenda for all regular meetings of the Board. Items of business may be suggested by any board member, staff member, student or citizen of the District by notifying the Superintendent or Board Chair. The final agenda will be reviewed by the Board chair and posted.

Opportunities for the audience to be heard will be included on the agenda as "Public Participation". The Board will follow the order of business on the final agenda as posted, unless the order is altered by a consensus of the Board. Additional items of business, not on the agenda, may be discussed and acted upon if a consensus of the Board agrees to consider them.

The agenda, together with supporting materials, will be distributed to board members by Friday preceding the Board meeting. The agenda will be available to the press and to interested patrons through the Superintendent's office at the same time it is available to the board members. Copies of the agenda for the press and public will not contain any confidential information included in the board members' packets.

A copy of the agenda will be posted in each district facility and at local post offices at least one day prior to the scheduled meeting. Members of the public may request a copy of the agenda through the Superintendent's office. Draft minutes shall be available to the public within a reasonable time after the meeting upon request. All approved minutes will be available on the District website or through the Superintendent's office.

Individuals who are visually impaired may request an agenda, plus any related supporting materials available to the general public, and/or minutes in an appropriate alternative format. All requests should be received at least 48 hours prior to a publicly scheduled board meeting. Appropriate auxiliary aids and services available to ensure equally effective communications with qualified disabled persons may include large print, Braille, audio recordings and readers. Primary consideration will be given to the requests of the disabled person in the selection of appropriate auxiliary aids and services.

Alternative equally effective communications will be used should the Board demonstrate that such requests would result in a fundamental alteration in the service, program or activity, or would cause undue financial and/or administrative burdens. Auxiliary aids and services for disabled persons will be available at no charge to the individual.
