

Homeless Students

Homeless students in the district will have access to the education and other services needed to ensure that an opportunity is available to meet the same academic achievement standards to which all students are held.

A liaison for students in homeless situations will be designated by the district to carry out duties as required by law.

The district will ensure that homeless students are not stigmatized nor segregated on the basis of their status as homeless. A homeless student will be admitted to the district school in the attendance area in which the student is actually living or to the student's school of origin as requested by the parent and in accordance with the student's best interest. Transportation will be provided to and from the student's school of origin at the request of the parent, or in the case of an unaccompanied student, the district's liaison for homeless students. If the homeless student continues his/her education in the school of origin but is living in an area served by another local education agency or district, the school or origin district and the current living local education agency must agree upon a method to apportion the responsibility and the cost for transportation to and from the school of origin. If the LEA's cannot agree, the responsibility and costs for transportation are to be shared equally.

The superintendent will develop administrative regulations to implement this policy.
