

Native American Impact Aid Funds

The district may claim children residing on Native American lands for the purpose of receiving federal funds pursuant to the Impact Aid statutes (20 U.S.C. Sections 7701-7714).

Administrative regulations shall be established and maintained to ensure:

1. The equal participation of Native American children in the educational programs and activities of the district on the same basis as all other district students;
2. Parents of such children and Native American tribes are afforded an opportunity to present their views on such programs and activities, including an opportunity to make recommendations on the needs of those children and how the district may help such children realize the benefits of district programs and activities;
3. Parents and Native American tribes are consulted and involved in planning and developing such programs and activities;
4. Relevant applications, evaluations and program plans are disseminated to the parents and Native American tribes;
5. Parents and Native American tribes are afforded an opportunity to present their views to the district regarding the district's general educational program.

The policy and administrative regulation will be reviewed regularly and modified, as appropriate.

Documentation demonstrating district compliance with the requirements of this policy and law will be maintained in the district office.
