

## **Cocurricular/Extracurricular Activities**

### **Eligibility for Extracurricular Activities**

1. Each student must meet the minimum requirements of the Oregon State Activities Association (OSAA) eligibility requirements and be on target for graduation to participate in cocurricular or extracurricular activities of the district. Rules for eligibility are outlined in Rule 8, individual eligibility of the OSAA Handbook. On target for graduation means to acquire the number of credits needed during the year so that graduation requirements can be met within the regular 4-year program.
2. Students who have failed in the previous semester or are at-risk of failing during the course of any semester will be referred to a district intervention program. The program as outlined in administrative regulation IK-AR will consist of student support in a noncredited class in which study skills and individual skill development help for all subject matter areas will be provided. The referral process will be as follows:
  - a. Students who have failed a class in the previous semester or year will automatically be referred to the intervention program for those classes failed in the previous semester or year;
  - b. Students who have failed a class at the nine-week or quarter will be automatically referred to the intervention program;
  - c. Students who have been identified by the classroom instructor at any time as struggling or at risk of failing any class will be referred to the intervention program by the teacher; and parents notified of the referral.

A student who is referred to, and placed in, an intervention program for support with any class will be required to attend until the semester break. He/she will receive no credit for the class and will be required to participate in activities designed to support the school work identified in the referral.

3. Transfer students will be considered eligible, at least until they have completed their first grading period at Pine Eagle High School, if they were eligible at their previous school.

### **Eligibility for Intracurricular Activities During School Time**

Those students who wish to represent the district in a contest or event that is held during the regular school day must meet an academic standard equal to the eligibility for extracurricular activities in order to be gone from school, except in cases when the activity is part of the instructional program of the class and students are to be graded on participation in the activity. In such cases the teacher will verify that the activity is connected and part of the instructional program.

Intracurricular activities are defined as activities that are directly or indirectly related to the curriculum of the school such as, but not limited to, math contests, science contests, FFA events, FBLA events, FHA events, solo and ensemble contests, speech contests, etc.

Class field trips where the whole class is expected to attend would not require academic eligibility.
