Tobacco-Free Environment

Violation of this policy will result in the following and shall involve proper law enforcement agencies:

1. First Offense

- a. Tobacco Three days of internal-suspension¹ and no participation in or attendance at any school event for 30 calendar days² and the internal-suspension has been served.
- b. Alcohol and/or Controlled Substances Ten days of internal suspension¹ and no participation in or attendance at any school event for 30 calendar days² and the internal-suspension has been served.
 - (1) Referral to proper law enforcement agency.
 - (2) Notify and request an immediate conference with the parent/guardian of the student.

2. Second Offense and/or Additional Offenses

a. Tobacco

Minimum: Five days of internal suspension¹ and no participation or attendance at any school event for 30 calendar days² and the internal-suspension has been served.

Maximum: Expulsion.

The student may be suspended from athletic participation for the remainder of the current sports season and the next sports season if this is the second tobacco offense within a 12-month period.

- b. Alcohol and/or Controlled Substances 30-day expulsion
 - (1) Referral to proper law enforcement agency.
 - (2) Notify and request an immediate conference with the parent/guardian of the student.
 - (3) Suspend the student pending an expulsion hearing.
 - (4) At the expulsion hearing, the student will be expelled for a minimum of 30 calendar days² from the date of the infraction and no participation in or attendance at school activities.
 - (5) The student is suspended from athletic participation for the remainder of the current sports season and the next sports season if this is the second drug or alcohol offense within a 12-month period.

¹Internal suspension will be served on Fridays or Saturdays unless otherwise approved by the superintendent.

²Calendar days will exclude vacation days.

Alternative to Discipline

As an alternative to discipline, students may be referred to a cessation and/or tobacco education class. Attendance at such classes is voluntary. Any cost related to cessation classes is the responsibility of the student and his/her parent. The district may also require the successful completion of a behavior modification plan.

Other

A referral to law enforcement and/or public health or tobacco coalition may be made at any time.
