The following procedures will be followed for students who violate the district's policy regarding possession and use of tobacco:

As is the case with our Substance Abuse policy, students will be encouraged to seek assistance to end their dependence on tobacco. Students who voluntarily refer to a counselor will not receive disciplinary action unless there is a violation. Although state law does not pertain to them, students 18 and over will still be subject to the conditions of the Board's policy and administrative regulations.
