

Release of Resident Students

The Board reserves the right to accept/reject release of resident students for attendance within another district based upon the availability of space, resources, personnel, appropriate programs and a positive review of educational records.

Resident students currently on approved tuition waivers as of the date of original adoption of Policy JECBC, June 5, 2001, shall be allowed to continue for subsequent years; however, this release shall not be construed as to automatically include siblings not currently on approved waivers.

Any future resident students submitting tuition waiver applications for consideration must meet one of the following criteria:

1. Child Care/Safety

If child-care issues cannot be established to ensure the safety of a child, a tuition waiver may be considered. A legitimate safety issue must be shown. Convenience cannot be the sole reason.

2. Curriculum

A curriculum area or program not offered within the District may be considered as a basis for an inter-district transfer. This covers very few areas. Extra-curricular activities will not be considered.

As of the date of adoption of revised Policy JECBC, January 18, 2007, transfers out of the District will be granted on a basis of 1:1 reciprocity, district by district.

Those students currently on approved inter-district transfers for curriculum as of the date of adoption of revised Policy JECBC, January 18, 2007, shall be allowed to continue so long as enrollment continues in the program upon which transfer was initially approved.

3. Continuation

- a. High School: If a student has completed his/her junior year in a high school located within another district prior to moving into the Phoenix-Talent School District area, he/she may continue at that high school through graduation.
- b. Those students currently on approved inter-district transfers for continuation as of the date of adoption of revised Policy JECBC, January 18, 2007, shall be allowed to continue through the highest grade offered in school of attendance.

The Board **may** assign discretionary authority to the Superintendent to waive the stipulated criteria on an individual case basis.
