Safety Program

Accidents are undesirable, unplanned occurrences that may result in tragic consequences - bodily harm, loss of school time, property damage, legal action and even fatality. It shall be the policy of the Board to guard against such accidents by taking all appropriate precautions to protect the safety of all students, employees, visitors and others present on district property or at school-sponsored events.

The practice of safety shall be a facet of the instructional plan of the district schools through educational programs in traffic and pedestrian safety, fire prevention, emergency procedures, etc., appropriately geared to students at different grade levels.

The superintendent or designee shall be responsible for the supervision of a safety program for his/her school. General areas of emphasis shall include, but not be limited to: in-service training; accident record keeping; plant inspection; driver and vehicle safety programs; fire prevention; emergency procedures; and the solution of traffic safety problems affecting students, employees and the community.
