Interscholastic Athletics

It shall be the policy of the Board to require each student who chooses to participate in an interscholastic athletic program to have on file, in the office of the superintendent or other office designated by the superintendent, a certificate of consent which is signed by the parent and a completed School Sports Preparticipation Examination form, as required by law before the student starts practice. This policy shall be in effect for each student for each sports session.

The student shall also comply with district requirements relative to insurance and shall meet participation requirements set by the Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA), the league and the school administration.

Students participating in extracurricular activities, including interscholastic programs, shall be governed by the rules of the Oregon School Activities Association, where applicable. The superintendent or designee is authorized to develop and enforce additional standards of conduct, provided that such standards shall be published and distributed to all students and shall be consistently applied and enforced. At the high school, the athletic director will work with coaches and the superintendent or designee in developing a handbook for interscholastic programs. The desire of the Board is that all district programs stress similar standards of conduct. It shall be the superintendent's responsibility to see that this occurs.
