Title IA/Parental Involvement

The Board recognizes that parent involvement is vital to achieve maximum educational growth for students participating in the district's Title IA program. Therefore, in compliance with federal law and Oregon Department of Education guidelines, the Board directs the Superintendent to ensure that parental involvement policies, procedures, programs, and activities are planned, implemented and reviewed with meaningful consultation with parents of participating students.

Each of the district's schools participating in Title IA will meet annually with parents of participating students to inform them of their right to be involved in the development of the district's parental involvement policy, the school's Title IA plan, the school-parent compact, and the planning of the school's parental involvement activities. Annual meetings will be held at a convenient time and all parents of participating students will be invited and encouraged to attend.

In fulfilling parental involvement requirements, each of the district's schools shall, to the extent practicable, provide full opportunities for the participation of parents with limited English proficiency, disabilities, parents of homeless and of migratory students, including providing information and school reports in a language and form parents understand.

The district's policy shall be adopted by the Board, reviewed annually and updated periodically in cooperation with parents, to meet the changing needs of parents and the schools and shall be distributed to parents of participating students in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.

The superintendent shall develop administrative regulations as necessary to implement this policy and meet the requirements of law.
